In the end 45 Athletes headed to Twizel our biggest contingent ever, while slightly underdone when it came to racing, we still achieved 16A Finals and 10B Finals (1 Gold and 3 Bronze).

"Special Mention" needs to be made of Rhys Casley who stepped up becoming our Covid Officer at Nationals from all reports he did an amazing job keeping the Covid Dogs at bay enabling our club boys to participate to differing degrees. His efforts have to be applauded.

As a Club we are delighted with the success of Mackenzie Tuffin and Ella Livingston winning the Senior Double our first Senior Title since 2016. In doing so they have received the Wellington Regions 1st senior pins since the acknowledgement was instituted in 2017. Mackenzie along with Arie Magasiva have been named in the New Zealand Under 21 Squad who will travel to Australia for the Trans-Tasman Regatta in June, I'd also like to mention

We of course can't leave out two very special Members Beth Ross and Philip Wilson who have represented New Zealand and Petone Rowing over a number of years resulting in a Silver and Gold Medals respectively at the 2021 Tokyo Olympics, we couldn't be prouder.

There are a number of Major Events on the horizon such as our 125th Anniversary all of which will need membership input. Fundraising still remains our biggest concerns be it for the ongoing Earthquake Strengthening or the need for replacement equipment. With the country moving out of Red Light and into Orange, we hope to see the return to more normal funding cycles.
